

SUSPENSION TO A DISTRICT-LEVEL HEARING

The Board recognizes that under Utah statute a minor between the ages of six (6) and eighteen (18) years of age is required to attend either a regularly established private or public school. The Board also recognizes that there are exceptions to this provision under the law and delegates to the Administration responsibility for developing guidelines to handle exceptions to these Compulsory Education requirements.

The Board, however, recognizes a responsibility to provide a safe learning environment where students are free from unlawful and violent acts. The Jordan Board of Education will not tolerate acts of violence, use or possession of a weapon, criminal behavior, or gang activity in or about Jordan District schools, school grounds, or school activities.

(Policy AS67 NEG)

Based on the Board's policy, your son/daughter is suspended to a District-Level Hearing because he/she represents a threat to the health and/or safety of students and employees. He/she may not enroll at or attend any Jordan District school until this suspension is resolved at a District-Level Hearing.
